## THURSDAY NIGHT LENTEN SUPPERS **AND WORSHIP**

Every Thursday night during Lent we will have the opportunity to gather in the Family Life Center at 6:15 for supper. # **OUTREACH NOTE**

Our special Week of Compassion (WOC) offerings will be received on Feb. 17 and Feb. 24. Please be in prayer for what you can do! Sign up for the luncheon offered on Sunday, Feb. 24, so you can see what and where your donations serve. We will have on display the Church World Service Kits and other information about WOC giving. The kits are small packages of supplies assembled volunteers and shipped to people in need around the world. Church World Service (CWS) provides school kits, hygiene kits, baby kits, and emergency clean up buckets. The contents of each kit have been selected with care based on years of experience to make them as useful as possible wherever they are sent. Kits may be sent to CWS all year. Kits are available for immediate response after a disaster here in the U.S. and in other parts of the world. The costs range from \$11 for a hygiene kit to \$50 for an emergency clean up bucket. Blankets can also be purchased for \$5.

There is a processing cost of \$2-\$3 for each kit to help pay shipping/delivery to the needed area. These are price ranges we can all afford. Giving to WOC is important. Sharing resources in response to the world's many needs is part of our faith. Lives are changed! Let yours be one of them.
